



## Star Swamp Heritage Trail

This brochure was originally published in 1988 as part of the Western Australian Heritage Trails Network — a Bicentennial Project involving community participation. Today, the Star Swamp Heritage Trail remains a part of the Heritage Trails Network established by the Western Australian Heritage Commission and is one of several State-wide routes designed to enhance awareness and enjoyment of Western Australia's natural and cultural heritage.

The Heritage Trails Network was jointly funded by the Commonwealth and Western Australian Governments under the Commonwealth / State Bicentennial Commemorative Program.

## **How To Get There**

Star Swamp Bushland Reserve is a 100 hectare native bushland reserve located approximately 15 kilometres north-west of Perth and is bordered by Marmion Avenue, North Beach Road, Hope Street and Beach Road.

The Star Swamp Heritage Trail is a 1.4 kilometre walk-trail which highlights the natural significance and role of the bushland and associated wetland in the history and development of North Beach and Watermans Bay. At a leisurely pace the walk-trail provides an enjoyable 40 minute walk through uniquely varying bushland ecosystems, with opportunities for bird-watching and wildflower photography. The reserve sustains a rich diversity of plant and animal life in tranquil settings. A walk through the bushland and around the wetland provides a rewarding experience.

## The Trail is accessible from three entrance points:

South - from the end of Groat Street.

North - from the end of Mary Street.

West - from Hope Street by the Swamp.


Following the trail route map, look for trail markers bearing the City of Stirling and Bushlinks logos.
